We were delighted by the way that many families had worked together to rise to the challenges the Eco Team set and the way that children are performing 'Services to our local area and to our Earth'.

Sapphire History: In history this week, the children were considering how important communication is for humans. The children were in pairs, sitting back-to-back. One drew a picture and the other had to replicate it based on what their partner said, without looking, and then they shared the picture afterwards to see how similar it was. They all really enjoyed it and realised how important language is and that to communicate effectively we

need to pass on the most important details. The teacher related this to how early humans living in the Stone Age would have used storytelling to pass on key information about food, dangers and safe places to live, as they did not yet have the ability to read and write.



Welcoming a new member of our community and learning more about babies: Ruby Class were very lucky to meet baby Holly this week. She is the younger sister of one of the children in the class and was born over Easter. Her mum brought her in to meet the children and 'big sister' was very proud. In RE, the children have been learning about how precious new life is to Christians. In Understanding of the World, they have been thinking about babies' needs and how babies can change their parents' lives. The children asked lots of questions about Holly and all had a closer look at her.





Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS): Next Wednesday, the school's SIAMS inspection will take place. Due to Covid, it has been quite a long time since the last inspection. The inspector will be in school for the entire day and will be talking to staff and children and observing daily life in the school. The focus is on how the school's Christian vision impacts on the whole school community. The inspector will be outside on Wednesday after school, briefly meeting with parents and she would love to hear your thoughts.

MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH

Father Simon writes:

Listening to the news this morning, it struck me how many of the stories we see, hear, or read involve 'service' - our collective worship theme this half of term.

I'm not just talking about 'services' (e.g. Labour planning to renationalise part of the rail



industry or the ongoing inquiry into the Post Office scandal), but about the way we serve one another (e.g. wars and conflict here, there, and everywhere; ethics in British

politics; the death of World Central Kitchen aid workers in Gaza; Donald



Trump's court hearings; the first personalised melanoma vaccine; the Met police antisemitism row). Many are stories castigating bad service or the way one another (usually the bulk of the news), others laud good service or behaviour (the good news).

we serve one another (usually the bulk of the news), others laud good service or behaviour (the good news story which usually comes at the end of a news bulletin).

Every single one of us has a unique set of talents, skills, gifts, and qualities which, whether we've nurtured them over the years or not, can be used - on a small or larger scale - for the use (or abuse) of others. These, people of faith believe, are God-given. For example, Christians read in their Bibles that: 'Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights' (James 1:17) and 'Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.' (1 Peter 4:10)



And - my word! - haven't we got a talented band of pupils here at Spellbrook?!! That was my conclusion after our collective worship last Monday when we explored how we might use our talents, skills, and gifts, not just for our own benefit and enjoyment but for the service and benefit of those around us.



The children picked out, at random, a skill or talent, such as 'Being a good listener', 'Being good at sports', 'Being organised', 'Able to make people smile', 'Being good at maths', 'Being trustworthy', 'Being good at gardening', from my 'Tub of Talent' (which, in a former life, was a beach bucket!), and I watched with delight as so many of the children put their hands up when they felt they possessed the particular skill, gift or talent which had been randomly plucked out of the tub. And then we took a moment to consider quietly what other skills or talents we might individually have that might be used to serve others. I'm

confident that we not only have a very talented school family, but one which continues to be aware that those gifts and qualities can be used to serve others in good ways.

That's, of course, a challenge for us all. I've no doubt that, if we parents and carers also spend a brief moment this weekend pondering what God-given gifts we might have which could be further nurtured for the benefit and service of those around us, we might be quietly surprised and uplifted.


