Using Images Safely and Responsibly

We all enjoy and treasure images of our family and friends. Family events, holidays and school events are moments we all like to capture in photos or on video.

We then have the added and exciting dimension of adding our images and video to our social network, such as Facebook, YouTube and many other online websites, some of which may be linked to the school in some way. This allows us to easily share our photos, video images and personal comments.

Whilst this is naturally useful, in schools and educational settings we do need to protect and safeguard all children and staff in our school, including those who do not want to have their images stored online or comments made about them.

Online Images and Video

What should we think about before adding online any photos video images or comments about another person or information about the school?

Are there any risks?

'Think Before Posting' Online

Know the Facts

- Once online any image or video can be copied and stay online forever.
- Some children are at risk and MUST NOT have their image put online. Not all members of the school community will know who they are.
- Some people do not want their images online for personal or religious reasons.
- Some children and staff may have a complex family background which means that image sharing online can have unforeseen consequences.

'Think Before Posting' Online

Recording School performances

School performances are often recorded and a DVD offered for sale. Where this is not the case, parents and carers are asked to seek permission from the Headteacher before taking photos or video of school performance for personal use. The school takes safeguarding of children seriously and if permission is granted we request that these images are not distributed or put online. This is to protect all members of the school community.

Local Authority Advice

In the event that any pupil or parent/carer of a child/ren being educated at Spellbrook Primary School is found to be posting libellous or defamatory comments on Facebook or other social network sites, they will be reported to the appropriate 'report abuse' section of the network site.

All social network sites have clear rules about the content which can be posted on the site and they provide robust mechanisms to report contact or activity which breaches this.

The school will also expect that any parent/carer or pupil removes such comments immediately. In serious cases the school will also consider its legal options to deal with any such misuse of social networking and other sites.

Safeguarding Children & Data Protection

We are judged on our ability to manage safeguarding and Data Protection. School leadership works hard to ensure our school complies with and understands current legislation and communicates to those who need to be aware of their responsibilities.
