FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Over the summer break we spent time reviewing the previous year and now that the term has settled in I wanted to share some of that with you. Attached to this newsletter is a letter from the Chair of the Governors, on behalf of the Governing body, with her comments.

We evaluated the intended actions and identified what we had completed and what needed further attention. The lost time due to restrictions and lock-downs has quite unsurprisingly meant that some plans will need further implementation time. I am very pleased with the way that the school community managed the constant changes and the mutual support and teamwork that was continuously evident was superb. I am reassured that despite the situation, we were able to make a lot of progress with our key intentions.

The quality of teaching has continued to be a focus, with a great deal of emphasis on the core subjects. Your children will be able to tell you about Read, Write, Inc. (if in EYFS or KS1), the Write Stuff, Whole Class Reading (WCR) and Power Maths. These approaches are working very well for most of the children and we have systems in place for those who need extra support. This year we are building on this by adding a specific spelling approach for KS2 that links closely with the Write Stuff approach and builds on the phonics of RWI. We are also putting extra time into handwriting so that the children write fluently with presentation that shows high expectations. For Maths, we have extra teaching support from Mrs Walton and in EYFS and KS1 are trialling a highly recommended approach to increasing number fluency, called Understanding Number.

We have developed our whole school curriculum maps so that all of the subjects have the time and focus built in for the children to develop knowledge and skills. We have made links between subjects as this helps children to build a strong understanding and retain the information. We have thought about the vocabulary that children need and this year we will be spending more time, ensuring the children extend their knowledge of subject specific words and are able to explain their thinking clearly. As you can imagine there are a lot of words to learn for each subject area. We are now able to get back to a full enrichment timetables with special focus weeks, visits

and visitors and thank you for your support with the financial side of some of these. Please remember that if that becomes a problem, do come and speak to me.

As we have such a small team, each teacher has a number of roles leading curriculum areas and they have all done an excellent job with the mapping and identifying the outcomes and vocabulary. They have also focused on the impact of the teaching by looking at books, watching lessons and talking to the children. The Governors were able to be part of this and now that the covid-19 restrictions have eased, they will be able to do that more easily. A School Improvement Advisor from HFL (Herts for Learning) comes in regularly to add her expertise to this monitoring and provide reports and information to add to the evaluations and to validate the quality of our development work.

Our systems for working with children who have SEND developed very well last year and Mrs Smith and I will be working together so that they continue to be of a high standard. If you do have any concerns, please speak to the class teacher or either one of us.

There are significant changes to the Early Years Framework that we follow in Reception and the Nursery and we will be working on that throughout the year. The aim is to improve the integration of the EYFS with the Key Stage 1 and therefore build more effectively on those foundations. We are also hoping to have more Nursery children as the year progresses, so if you know of any parents looking for nursery place, please point them in our direction.

I would like to thank the parents that do so much to support their children's learning and one of the ways to make the greatest impact is by reading. If you are not reading with your children for a few minutes most nights, please do so. The difference it makes is so significant. Also we are finding that some children need to spend more time on writing skills, particularly careful formation of letters. We are asking some parents to help with this as little and often work.

Thank you for your continued support. Now that the restrictions are less impactful, I am happy to see parents with any issues and concerns, so if you need to, please do get in touch.



MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH



Fr Simon, our Vicar and governor, writes:

This Sunday at Great St Mary's we're going to be celebrating the Feast of St Michael

and All Angels. No, this isn't the Church's annual adoration of Marks and Spencer and their staff. It's an opportunity to honour St Michael, the greatest of all the archangels, and all those other celestial beings scattered

through the pages of the Bible who do God's bidding.

St Michael has been venerated since the earliest times of the Christian Church. Indeed, the feast is sometimes known as 'Michaelmas', which comes from the shortening of the two words 'Michael's Mass', in the same way that 'Christ's Mass' was shortened to 'Christmas'.

As well as being the patron saint of police officers and the military, St Michael keeps a careful watch on, amongst others, Vatican City, Germany, France, Dumfries in Scotland, and the sick.


One of the most famous images of St Michael hangs on the wall

outside Coventry Cathedral. 'St Michael's Victory over the Devil' was created in 1958 by the great sculptor Sir Jacob Epstein. It's a fitting symbol of the triumph of good over evil following the destruction of the city and old cathedral by the Nazi Luftwaffe in World War II, and the rising from the ruins of Sir Basil Spence's new cathedral.

And that message of good defeating evil is at the heart of our Bible readings this Sunday. With the help of the angels, Christians are called to continue bringing kindness into this world - though, admittedly, we too often fail at that task. Even so, every drop of kindness each of us can bring into the world helps to create an ocean of goodness and peace for benefit of all.







