There has been a lot going on this week. We now have another parent on our Governing Body, Mrs Elspeth Booth and a new staff governor, Mrs Sarah Cook. I am grateful to them both for stepping forward and supporting the work of the school in this way.



We had PSHE live lessons on the screens in the classrooms and a number of parents joined at lunchtime for a presentation about the Coram Life programme, SCARF that we follow.

During the week that we shall be celebrating Harvest at Great St Mary's Church, it was most timely to see the gardening club harvesting some of the vegetables they had grown amongst the flowers at the front of the school. They



enjoyed picking the sweetcorn and emptying the potato bags then cooking and eating them with lots of butter. They kindly shared and I must say that the sweetcorn was most delicious.

On Thursday, the children had a fantastic time learning some adapted and inclusive games. These are all games that are played at the Paralympics and can be played by anyone, including those with disabilities. The coaches who came have different disabilities. The sports included sit-down volleyball, Boccia and visually-impaired football.

The children got really into the games. Many said that trying to kick or save a ball (even one with a bell in) whilst wearing a blindfold was a completely new and strange experience. The coach was impressed with the number of children who scored. One group managed the all-time school record of over 350 consecutive passes of the volleyball and were very proud.

The children were also fascinated with Mark's prosthetic leg and enjoyed asking questions including whether that made him a cyborg. He answered happily and with humour and showed his party trick of twisting the leg all the way round. It is part of our vision to help the children to accept that disabilities don't prevent people from achieving.

Today were very much looking forward to the Harvest Service and hope that many of you will be with us. What a busy week!
