### FROM THE HEADTEACHER

The end of a busy half term arrives. The children have had a productive half term and a great deal of excellent learning has been going on. We have continued to prioritise the core subjects but also ensure that all of the other subjects are taught effectively. We have continued with the writing approach that we introduced last year, the Write Stuff' and are happy that it enables teachers to use rich texts, model effective writing, including grammatical structure and increase the vocabulary that children are able to access. We are continuing to focus on presentation and handwriting and know that this is still very much a 'work in progress' for some. I have seen some excellent writing and some of our stronger writers are regularly 'deepening the moment'. This refers to thinking deeper into the language and structure that they are using so that their writing has a greater impact on the reader.

We have a new approach to spelling as we have found that this is still an area of difficulty for many children and will be assessing its impact later on this term. Our phonics continues to be a main focus for the younger children and I am very pleased with the start that the Reception children have made in learning their sounds and starting to correctly form letters. Please do help them with this and I know the teachers are happy to provide guidance and materials to support.

We are continuing with the Power Maths and fluency. We have seen that some children's times' tables have really improved and this is due to regular practise including the use of Times Tables Rock Stars. I cannot emphasise too strongly the positive impact on all of their problem solving that knowing these number facts brings. If you have not done so, please check out our news and galleries on the website as we share photographs of some of the enrichment activities

Teachers will be inviting you to discussions about your child's learning. This will take place on the second week back and will be live parent consultations. This will provide the opportunity for you to see your child's/children's work as well as talking to the teacher/s.

We have established the different groups to enable children to develop leadership skills and have opportunities to take responsibility and learn from that.

Have a good half term and stay safe.



### MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH




Fr Simon writes:

The vicarage here in Sawbridgeworth is the 23rd address I've had in my life. Give or take the odd month, that's one property every two years!!



We need everyone to play their part in keeping the roads near schools safe.


#### **DRIVERS SHOULD NOT:**

- Only visit houses where there are signs that trick or treaters are welcome, such as Halloween decorations and pumpkins outside.
- Keep your Halloween 'tricks' safe damage to property or hurting someone is a crime. Threatening and abusive behaviour can amount to an offence too.
- Remember road safety rules, particularly after dark.
- Wear something bright so that drivers can see you.
- If you are planning on hosting your own firework party make sure you tell all your neighbours, especially those with pets who may be affected by the noise.
