FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Ofsted Report

I was really pleased to receive the Ofsted report yesterday. It confirms that our journey towards providing the best education for the children is heading in the right direction and that we have now past the milestones of the criteria for good. This is a result of the teamwork and hard work put in by everyone. This is particularly pleasing in the light of the difficult times that the pandemic has brought about and the negative impact this could have had on our improvement plans.

The recognition that: "It is a pleasure to be at this school. Pupils feel respected and cared for well. Pupils, staff, governors and parents all mention the 'family feel' where everyone looks out for each other," was very pleasing.

Reading is an important focus during the inspection and this was also recognised.

"Leaders have made reading a top priority. Staff have been trained to teach early reading well. Teachers spot pupils who are not keeping up. Teaching assistants are skilled at teaching the school's reading programme."

We know that we have more to do for a very small number of children and alongside other strategies we are ordering some new books that will be pitched at their level but will also be great books to read.



I was very pleased to see the many positives in the report and also to recognise that for the areas of improvement we already have plans in place. We are looking forward to the next steps in our journey together with the confidence inspired by this success and again I want to express my gratitude for your support.

Today the children have made Christmas decorations. They have made a whole range of different ones and the teachers have come up with great ideas. I have seen a high level of focus and concentration and this has resulted in some lovely items. Frank and Natasha have provided more information. **E-Safety Update:** Childnet have produced a series of six short videos based on the SMART rules which parents can use to discuss a range of online safety issues with their children. Goldilocks is quite an old book but this version is a twist on the original fairy tale with a social media slant to help educate children about the potential consequences of being unkind, getting carried away with selfies and oversharing images. 
