#### FROM THE HEADTEACHER

As the first half term of year, comes to a close, I am aware that we have had a much more straightforward one than last year. However, it is obvious that many of the children are tired, as is often the case towards the end of a half term, and hopefully next week will be pleasant and restful and give them all time to recharge. The staff will benefit from the same. I am grateful for the support of families in many ways and now that we are less restricted, have been able to speak to parents in person more and help solve any issues that have arisen. Please feel free to contact me via the office or dojo if you do have any issues or concerns.

I am pleased to note that the attendance has improved from last term and the overall attendance since September is now at 95.2%. This is still below our target but moving in the right direction. I hope that the impact of the pandemic continues to reduce. I cannot stress too strongly how absence impacts the children. It is very difficult for them to come into a sequence of learning part way through and although teachers offer support, they cannot immediately make up for the loss of previous lessons and the learning that accumulates from them. This often leaves a child with unpleasant and negative feelings.

It seems that we are in a period of change with regards to staff and unfortunately the School Business Manager, Simone Hayward, will be leaving at Easter. I encourage staff to progress professionally, and am pleased for them when they do so but at the same time it is a shame when we lose valued members. Simone has been a very hard

working and valued member of the team for a long time and has managed the finances and personnel superbly during the last two years. Our loss is her new employer's gain.

This year we have been considering ways to make homework more relevant and motivational for the children.

We are also very keen that children develop their fluency in maths and as readers and this happens when children put extra time into purposeful practice. Today, we have been awarding certificates for children who have completed the topic tasks, their weekly maths and their reading. I am so pleased that many children have achieved the different awards, showing that they have kept up the reading and maths as well as engaging so well with the topic tasks. I have seen so many excellent pieces of topic work, including lots of brilliant models and it is evident that many families have provided a great deal of support. I heard in detail how one grandfather provided the technical expertise for this superb biome model. I am aware that some children will be disappointed to see others receive the gold certificate when they



children will be disappointed to see others receive the gold certificate when they have not, but we hope that together, we can motivate them to complete the required amount of work next time.

#### **MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH**




Fr Simon writes:

#### The Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 Time Capsule and Tree planting

To honour HM the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 the Town Council will be burying a time capsule and planting a tree in Monastery Park.

The Town Council is calling for residents of Bishop's Stortford to supply a record of their memories' of the Queen's 70 year reign to be included in the capsule. The entries can be written text or stories, drawings, photographs, newspaper clippings or small physical items etc. The Council will also include items representing Bishop's Stortford in 2022 such as a map, newspaper etc.

All entries can be dropped off to the Tourist Information Centre either in person, via post or electronically via tic@bishopsstortford.org until 4pm on 22 June 2022 (this deadline has been extended from January 2022). Physical entries must be submitted with a donation form available from Town Council's website or at the Tourist Information Centre. For preservation all entries must be in polyethylene bags (a sandwich bag). Please not do include any entries with batteries, staples, paper clips, rubber bands, cling type films such as protective wrappers or any food products as this destroys preservation.

The time capsule will be buried and the tree will be planted on 2 July 2022 in Monastery Park, where there will be a ceremony with the Mayor. Members of the public are also invited to attend the ceremony and further details will be released soon.

The Tourist Information Centre is located at 2 Market Square Bishop's Stortford CM23 3UU and is open Monday to Saturday 9:30am-4pm, closed for lunch from 12:25pm - 1pm and is closed on Sundays and public holidays. There is limited space in the capsule so entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis. Maximum size of any item is 30cm (L) x20cm (W) x 10cm (D) cm and have a maximum weight of 250g.
