### FROM THE HEADTEACHER

I am very pleased to be back in school today. It is quite frustrating not being able to do so and I sympathise with everyone who has had the virus. With regards to Covid-19, we shall be reviewing our expectations and guidelines over the break in the light of the expected changes from the Government. The simple steps people are encouraged to follow are:

- Be kind respect people wearing masks or keeping their distance from you. They may well be very vulnerable to infection.
- Be informed know your level of risk and get good, trusted advice on managing it.
- Be vaccinated or boosted ensure you and those around you are vaccinated when invited.
- Be safe manage your risk when socially mixing (hands, face, space, fresh air).
- Be prepared if you get Covid, stay at home and get early treatment should you need it.
- Be supported as well as your family and friends, HertsHelp can offer support.



Yesterday was our Easter Service. Last Easter we had recently returned from lockdown and held our service outside.

This year, due to our recent outbreak we have again had to restrict the way the service has been held. Although our hall is quite small, we can open the panels and extend into two of the classrooms. This has been very useful when needing to create more space.

Thank you to Father Simon for leading the service. He contacted me afterwards and let me know that the children had sung very well. I do value the times that all the staff and children can get together with a

shared focus, benefiting from activities that involve everyone in some way and develop that sense of community. All schools do this, but I do feel there is a difference in a small school where everyone really knows everyone else.

Over recent weeks, the children have been learning about Easter. This is done at different levels throughout the school, starting with the basic story for Ruby class, reinforcing and developing that in Sapphire class and considering deep questions such as, "Why do Christian's call the day that Jesus died, Good Friday?" in Emerald class and thinking through what sacrifice is and the significance to Christianity in Diamond class. The depth of understanding that children can demonstrate is surprising to many and one of the reasons that many of us love teaching.

Today has been the last day with us for two much loved members of our team. Mr Cattlin has been such a fantastic Premises Manager, completing all of the aspects of the role with a smile and always willing to lend a hand. He begins a well-deserved retirement, although I strongly suspect there will be very little 'putting his feet up' and many little and not so little tasks for him to get on with.



Miss Hayward came to school as the administrator and over the last two years has taken the role of Business Manager. This is such an important role and underpins everything

in terms of money and staffing and is a huge amount of responsibility. She has been so helpful in many ways, a great member of the team also being prepared help out with anything else that needs doing, including managing the lunch hall when we have been short-staffed. She leaves to take on another role that uses her financial expertise. Over my career, I have worked with many colleagues and I can honestly say that the respect I have for both Mr Cattlin and Ms Hayward is second to none. We all thank them very much and wish them well.

Despite the rather mixed weather at the moment, some of the more optimistic forecasters are suggesting a sunny Easter. I hope that is the case and we can all enjoy being outside, having fun with our families as well as perhaps enjoying an Easter egg or two, I certainly intend to. I hope that you all remain safe and well and we see everyone back ready for a hardworking and fun summer term.

### **MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH**

### Fr Simon writes:

I know that the past few weeks have been so difficult for the school because of the challenges of Covid. The teachers, staff and pupils have done a brilliant job of keeping things going as normally as possible.



Sadly though, because of the difficulties, the children weren't able to get to the church for their end of term Easter service yesterday. That didn't stop Revd Debbie, our Lay

Minister Diana Kitson and me getting into school yesterday though for an uplifting moment with the whole school. Readings were delivered with panache, and songs were sung with gusto.



And having heard the story about Jesus being welcomed into old Jerusalem, riding on the back of a donkey, we reflected how, only days later, the crowd turned on him and cried for him to be crucified.

I shared with the children my brother's experience of being an Aston Villa supporter. I've always had a soft spot for the team too; when I was growing up, they were our nearest Premiership - or, in old money, First Division - team to where we lived. So, on several occasions, I've been to Villa Park with him. And there's always been a

great atmosphere.

But it has to be said: a few years ago, Villa weren't so popular. They were losing games left, right and centre, and dropped into the Championship league. And, when you went to a match at that time, the atmosphere was no longer one of joy but of disillusionment. The cheers of celebration had turned into the jeers of failure, and, for a while, many of the faithful Villa fans stopped supporting them.


I wondered with the children yesterday during our end of term service how Jesus must have felt when his popularity waned in the course of just one week when the crowd's cheers of celebration turned into jeers of hatred.

I'm delighted to say that Aston Villa, back in the Premiership, aren't doing too badly again now, and the great atmosphere is back.

I'm also delighted to say that Jesus' followers also have something to cheer about. The betrayal of Jesus may have resulted in his death on a Roman cross. But only three days later - on that first Easter Day - he rose again to new life. His resurrection proved to his followers that Jesus is more than a good man. It proved to them that he is what he said he is: the Son of God.


The only decision we have to make this Easter is whether we are going to support him or are we going to turn our backs on him. Are we going to cheer for him or jeer him?



# LET'S MAKE HOT CROSS BUNS!

### WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

### For the buns:

500g wholemeal flour 60g HalfSpoon sugar 7g fast-action yeast 75g sultanas 25g dried mixed fruit 1 tsp ground cinnamon 1 tsp mixed spice 300ml skimmed milk

30g low-fat spread 1 egg For the crosses:

### For the crosses

75g plain flour 75ml water

### For the glaze:

beezeebodies.com

3 tbsp apricot jam

### WHAT TO DO:

- 1.Add the flour, half spoon, yeast, sultanas, mixed fruit, cinnamon and mixed spice to a large mixing bowl and mix together.
- Add the milk and spread to a small saucepan and bring to a slight simmer before removing from heat.
- 3. In a separate bowl, whisk the egg.
- 4. Create a well in the flour mixture and gradually stir in the wet ingredients to form a dough.
- 5. Transfer to a floured surface and knead for 5 minutes.
- 6.Return the dough to the bowl, cover with cling film or a clean tea towel and leave to rise for 1 hour or until the dough has doubled in size.
- 7.Transfer the dough onto a floured surface and squeeze out the air. Split the dough into 15 equally sized pieces (about 70g each). Shape each piece into a bun and place on a baking tray lined with baking paper.
- 8. Cover the buns with cling film or a clean tea towel and leave to prove for 1 hour.
- 9. Preheat the oven to 200C. In a small bowl, mix the flour and water to form a paste to create the crosses. Transfer the paste into a piping bag or sealable food bag (you can cut off a corner of the bag to act as a nozzle)
- 10.Once the buns have proved, pipe crosses onto the top of each bun. Bake in the oven for 15-20 minutes until golden.
- 11.Gently heat 3 tbsp apricot jam in a pan and glaze the buns while they are still warm. If you don't have a pastry brush to glaze with, you can just use the back of a spoon.

**How you can help:** the best way to provide humanitarian help for the people of Ukraine is through financial donations to organisations with a presence in the region. There are many organisations across the UK and internationally who have launched appeals to raise money towards providing humanitarian relief in Ukraine. <u>The Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) Ukraine</u> <u>Appeal</u> is one such appeal and also UK Government matched. The money raised will fund food, water, medicine, protection and trauma care for people fleeing the war.
