Next week is SATs week for Year 6. Teachers, children and parents across the country have been preparing for this for quite some time. As the SATs had been postponed for the last two years, this is the first time I have been part of it at Spellbrook. We all have our responsibilities with this and one of mine is to ensure the correct and very precise procedures are followed, including ensuring that no test scripts are opened until a few minutes before each test. I have to sign a declaration that all is done according to the rules. We have a timetable that is adhered to by all Year 6 classes in the country and there will be many sighs of relief on Thursday morning, when

the final maths paper has been completed. There will then be the wait until the results arrive in July. Mrs Cook and the year 6 pupils have been preparing for this and this week have been focusing on the last minute revision. Today, they were all given a slip of paper like this and a cookie, which I believe they ate rather rapidly. As you can see by the picture they are all approaching this positively and we trust that they will continue to



do so. They will start Monday morning with a SATs breakfast together, then will start their first paper. All of the staff wish them luck and know they will do their best, which is all we can ask.



Seven children from Year 6 attended the Leventhorpe Book Awards on Tuesday. They had to read books which were selected by Leventhorpe and they got together with children from other local schools to discuss the books and take part in some friendly competition.

taking place were original and thoughtful. You've obviously prepared the students really well in advance." To be honest, I think the pupils prepared themselves and enjoyed reading the books, so the credit goes to them.

Imagine their surprise and joy when Peter, after praying over her in Jesus' name, presented Tabitha - alive - to the community!


