




Ruby Class have been outside on the field, developing their mindfulness techniques.

Mrs Hasty, who organised the week, with the help of the Junior Travel Ambassadors was really pleased.

A Warm Welcome

This week we have welcomed two Ukrainian children to our school. Both Sapphire and Emerald class were very excited and many children spent time

over the weekend learning how to say hello in Ukrainian. I trust it has not been too overwhelming for the brother and sister, as so many children have wanted to help, support and befriend them. The children in Emerald class quickly got to grips with using google translate, which translates from one language to any other. They have been sharing information and instructions. One of the laptops is now set up with the Ukrainian alphabet, enabling work that is typed in Ukrainian to be instantly translated into English for the teacher to see.

It is great to see how technology can open up communication and enable inclusion.



Unity

Diamond class have been thinking about Unity. They have discussed texts from different religions that encourage unity across the world. They looked at symbols and graphics that are used to communicate the idea of unity and created some of their own. (see above)

Cricket

Year 5 and Year 6 girls went to Sawbridgeworth Cricket Club with four other schools for a competition. Mya and Teddy provided a brief report.

Crucial Crew

Each year in May, nearly 700 Year 6 pupils from Bishop's Stortford, Sawbridgeworth and nearby village primary schools visit The St. Barnabas Centre in Thorley to take part in 'Crucial Crew'. The pupils take part in a variety of interactive scenarios about personal safety, including e-safety, first-aid, dangerous substances, road safety, fire safety and managing money. Crucial Crew encourages pupils to become independent and to make healthy choices. It teaches them to recognise dangers and to understand what to do when they feel unsafe. Safety in the Car Park

When I first joined Spellbrook I was struck by the unique drop-off system. This is the only school I know that has such a system and I believe it works really well because everyone works together thoughtfully. I have just a few reminders and requests to help continue that and to ensure everyone is safe.

Please can I remind parents that staff come out at 8:40 to supervise the drop-off and open the gates. We are keen to avoid cars backing up into the road, so please do not arrive too early. When we do start the drop off, the likelihood of backing up into the road is reduced if all drivers maintain minimum but safe gaps between vehicles, however please be cautious as you drive around as I have noticed more children using the crossing from the centre of the car park and want to ensure they are safe. If you are parking up or your child is getting out of your vehicle to do this, please ensure it is safe to do so. Could you also ensure that they wait calmly at the gate if they are there before it is opened at 8:40.


