FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Today, the children have been celebrating Euro 2020 and raising funds for the PTA by wearing their football shirts. Lots of the children have enjoyed seeing who supports the same team as them. The support from the PTA is greatly appreciated and this year they have purchased an additional Smart Screen for the library and helped increase our stock of books. Thank you for helping them.

It is always sad to say goodbye. I have some news that is simultaneously positive and negative. The positive is that Heather Foster, our SENCO, has secured a promotion and will become a Deputy Headteacher at a school in Ware after the summer break. This is a great achievement and fantastic career opportunity for her, and she will be a great asset to her new school. The negative is that she will be leaving us at the end of this school term. We are very sad to be losing her from the team. She has worked at Spellbrook for



a long time as a teacher, SENCO and a member of the Senior Leadership Team. She has had a huge and very positive impact on the school and the children. Since her return from maternity in September, I have enjoyed working with her and am exceedingly pleased with the way that she has helped, not only to ensure that our SEND provision is at a high standard but also to have a very positive impact on many other parts of the school work, such as the teaching of English, Maths, music and PSHE and the development of our lunchtime provision. This will mean some changes in the way we operate and one is that from September, Charlotte Smith will begin training as SENCO. She will keep her classroom teacher role, and as I have had previous experience as a SENCO, will be in a position to provide assistance and support, so that the needs of all children with SEND continue to be met and their families continue to be communicated with. The class teachers are remaining where they are next

year, enabling them to build on this year's experiences. We will send more information about next year and will arrange a transition morning for the children in July.

Please could you make sure your child/ren have 24 hour sun cream on before coming in on the hot days and that they bring a hat. Thank you to so many of you for making sure your child always has a water bottle.

Diamond Class have started their new topic on Ancient Greece. They have a lot of new vocabulary to learn and understand.


MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH

Hertfordshire Personal Safety Survey

Following the death of Sarah Everard earlier this year, the County Community Safety Unit (CCSU) are currently producing a needs assessment on violence against women and girls.

As part of this work, they are undertaking a public survey of Hertfordshire residents to understand their experiences and feelings of personal safety, which will help to inform recommendations for the needs assessment. The survey will remain open until Friday 9th July.

This survey has been widely disseminated amongst adults, but it is really important that young people also have an opportunity to respond (aged 10+). Please note the survey is open to males and females of all ages to enable us to compare experiences and feelings of safety, so therefore we ask that any advertising refers to the survey as the 'Hertfordshire personal safety survey' to ensure that males are equally encouraged to take part.

Wild World Heroes – Summer reading challenges in libraries

Libraries across Hertfordshire are currently preparing for this year's summer reading challenge — Wild World Heroes. Every year the Reading Agency oversees this exciting programme, which is run by library staff. It starts on Saturday 10th July and runs until Saturday 4th September.

This summer children will help six fictional characters - 'wild heroes' who live in the town of 'Wilderville'. As they read library books, children will collect transformation stickers to add to a foldout town map, fixing the environmental problem in each area and making Wilderville a better home for everyone.


Research shows that children's reading can 'dip' during the long holidays and this can cause them to lose confidence when they return to school. The summer reading challenge encourages children to get into libraries and helps them keep up their reading skills. By providing fun reading activities this summer the challenge will also play a key role in supporting reading catch-up after a difficult year. It is the UK's biggest promotion of reading for children – in 2019 20,897 children took part in Hertfordshire – and it's free.

Children are challenged to read six library books, eBooks or eAudiobooks of their choice during the holidays. For every two books they read they are rewarded with a set of stickers. When they have completed the challenge, they will receive a bookmark, certificate and medal. The summer reading challenge materials are suitable for visually impaired children.
