FROM THE HEADTEACHER

It's amazing how quickly routines re-establish. Despite missing school for two months, the children have all quickly come together resuming friendships and getting used to the routines and expectations again. A lot of reminding about focusing and thinking of the needs of others has been required this week, but no more than we expected. One or two children have needed a little extra support, coping with being back in large groups and we had anticipated this. The long term well-being of all of the children is a key priority for us. Before Easter we shall be using a questionnaire with all of the KS1/2 children to find out a bit more about how they are feeling about different aspects of school life and learning and will plan accordingly.

We are delighted to welcome new children and their families to the school. They had officially joined earlier this time, but the children had not met their class mates in real life. We have two children in Diamond, one in Emerald and one in Sapphire.

This week has been British Science week and much of the learning, has been science based. This has included a focus on Space and Mrs Le Duc arranged for four special visitors to share their expertise. Three of these interacted live with the children,


Three of these interacted live with the children, talking to them and sharing images and videos from Teams. These focused on space exploration, star gazing and space careers. We have studied space

It was originally connected to our local 'mother' church, with people returning to their

So the annual return to the 'mother' church inevitably became a great occasion for family reunions.
