

SPELLBROOK NEWSLETTER FRIDAY 16th OCTOBER 2020

Dear Parents,

I can hardly believe that we are coming towards the end of this half term. In many ways it feels like my first term here. I am preparing a review of the half term that I will share with you next week.

Today we are saying goodbye and thank you to Luke, the sports coach from Super Star Sports, who will be taking a new job nearer his home. He has led activities at lunchtime, run PE lessons for each class and taken after school clubs this half term and we wish him well in his new post. Josh has been here to learn the ropes this week and will take over from him next week.

Each week, the teachers and I meet after school and part of our time is spent focusing on the key areas for improvement in our School Plan. This week, we have been looking at a range of the children's Power Maths books across the school. Power Maths follows the maths mastery approach and one of the key features is the reflection on the key learning from the lesson. We have been checking that children of all abilities are completing this part. Another key element is the challenge activity that deepens the thinking of those pupils who are the more able mathematicians and stretches them to apply their knowledge to complex problems. We are checking that as many pupils as are able, are getting onto and completing this. Teachers will be able to confirm whether your child is working at this higher level when you speak to them after half term for the teacher/ parent consultations that we are planning.

Please remember that for every child in the school, reading at home is a core of our homework (sharing books currently for Ruby Class) and the children need this regular practise to develop their fluency with decoding and comprehension. It also has a very strong impact on their vocabulary development. Please make sure your child is reading most nights and that the records are signed.

We have had to put a temporary stop to football at break and lunchtimes for Diamond Class. They will only be playing football when they have a sports coach as referee. There have been too many occasions where their over enthusiastic tackling and over competitive manner has caused problems. We will review this after half term.

Our Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) is proving to be a real asset and the children are really benefitting from having their PE on an all-weather surface. They also spend much less time retrieving balls that have escaped their control and more time developing their skills. Please make sure they all bring in long sleeved tops on PE days.





We hope you all have a lovely weekend and we look forward to welcoming you all back at school on Monday 19th October 2020.
