FROM THE HEADTEACHER

This week has been assessment week for Diamond Class. We have done this to replace the Statutory SATS and provide robust information about the progress that children have made throughout the year and for the Year 6 pupils, their progress through the school. The children have completed papers under exam conditions. The results are very pleasing and many children have met the targets that were set before the pandemic and show that over the year, the work in school in the autumn term, the work at home in spring and the work, including our catch up programme have ensured that these children as a group have done extremely well and are well prepared for secondary school. I am very pleased with this and proud of the hard work the staff, children and parents have put in. We will be providing parents with specific information about the outcomes before the end of term.


Next week, we will be carrying out assessments in the other classes, although these will not be following the same testing format and will just be independent work in class as far as the children are concerned. We will be sharing our findings with you at parent consultations (by phone) which we are planning for the week starting the 12^{th} July.





This has provided specific information on some key issues with the mastery approach but also identified some future work that we will get involved in to pilot an approach to increasing children's fluency whilst they are in Reception and Key Stage 1. 









Symptoms of the plague (Emerald)

Geneva, and the fallout following the government's decision to postpone the further easing of Covid restrictions have, this past week, had me thinking about what 'good disagreement' looks like.






