Dear Parents.

This week has been a normal and busy week. We have had two new children join Ruby class, so welcome to them and their families.

Unfortunately, we have been short-staffed in the office. Ms Onyeka is well, but working from home as the school that one her children attends, has had to send children home to isolate. Please continue to send emails, as Ms Onyeka will respond to them. She is fulfilling her homeschooling duties so may not be able to respond immediately. If it is urgent, please phone the school.

This week, the teachers have received training on the use of the new Clever Touch boards that we now have. The boards enable teachers to work in very flexible ways, using websites and videos and other resources that they have planned for their lessons, enabling them to more easily integrate technology into their teaching.

The Governors met for their termly full Governing Body meeting this week. Heather Foster and Graham Swanton have been welcomed as new staff and parent representatives. As part of the role, the Governors monitor how the school is progressing in meeting the priorities and actions of the School Plan. The School Plan has the following priorities:

To ensure a high quality of education for all pupils in the school;

To ensure that behaviour and attitudes are at a consistently high standard throughout the school;

To ensure that provision for personal development demonstrates that the school consistently promotes the extensive personal development of all pupils;

To ensure that through effective leadership and management, the education that the school provides has a positive impact on all its pupils.

I am pleased with the progress that is being made in all of these areas and that we are finding solutions to the difficulties presented by Covid-19. Like most of you, we are just getting on with



it. It has been hard to do all of the things that promote personal development, as we have not been able to be part of competitions, go out on trips and have a range of visitors into the school.

As mentioned last week, the teachers are finding ways to make sure the curriculum is stimulating and provokes thought. This week, as part of their topic "Climate and Weather", Emerald class have been learning all about the world's hottest, wettest places and finding out about monsoons and what it is like to live in these places. They have been lucky enough to speak with Mr Nicholson (Mrs McDonald's dad) who is an English Teacher in Vietnam. He showed Emerald Class a small remote village who have unfortunately been affected by a recent monsoon.



He explained to the class about where the villagers live, how the monsoon has devastated the village and how as part of the aid relief team, he was able to support the village with food and clothing donations.





This reinforces our focus on perseverance and provides a very up-to-date example of our values. Emerald Class have complied a list of questions to send back to him and are awaiting his response next week!

We are also finding that Covid-19 has a significant impact on our wider communication with parents. Ordinarily, we would be inviting you all in to events and opportunities to see more of the activities in school. That is not something we can currently do, but we have been working on our school website and also planning ways to increase the opportunities for you to find out more about your child's experiences and learning at school.
