FROM THE HEADTEACHER

This half term has enabled us to get into our usual school routines, albeit with the differences still required from the Covid-19 restrictions. We have operated within bubbles but have been able to be a little more outward looking. With careful planning we have started to have more visitors involved in the school.

The term started with the BMX workshop outside for Emerald and Diamond Classes and it set the tone in terms of ensuring we focus on having an 'I Can' attitude, as well as being a lot of fun for many of the children. Playtimes have continued to be in key stage bubbles.

We have recently moved from having collective worship on teams or in classes, to having some within the key stages in the hall and even having Father Simon and Reverend Debbie, actually with us, rather than on the screen. I am grateful that parents have adhered to our requests regarding social distancing and the daily arrangements for drop off and parking, but I am mindful that we still need to be careful to avoid the spread of the virus.

After half term, we will be having cricket sessions from Hertfordshire Cricket Club, swimming for Diamond Class and their Activity Week later in June. We are still awaiting further guidance regarding the restrictions after the 21st June and are not yet in the position to have large group of parents all together at activities and therefore, as things currently stand, Sports Day will be for the children only. We will prioritise the Year 6 leavers so that whatever we arrange, their parents can be included.

We have sent Annual Reports out to provide information about your child's learning and progress and although the offical SATs are not taking place, we will be having assessment weeks in school so that we have up-to-date and reliable information about the pupils progress and attainment for the year as a whole.

On Thursday, Ruby Class then Sapphire Class had drama sessions led by Perform Drama School. They got really involved in their underwater adventure. After the session, I spent time with Ruby Class and they told me that they had been in the deep sea and they had been swimming around, taking pictures of the sea life: puffer fish, dolphins, sharks, gold fish, and a sea monster. When the sea monster came, they had to become star fish and freeze, so they wouldn't be eaten. They recalled that the monster had taken a pearl and that they had to follow it and when it dropped the pearl they were able to get it and swim away. They then had a party. It was evident that they had thoroughly enjoyed the session and they impressed me with their enthusiasm and the detail they had recalled.



I ask some of them how they felt. Henry liked the part, "When we were eating crab cakes –but they weren't real." Arthur's favourite was, "When the sea monster went away to find his mummy and he couldn't find his mummy." Harvey liked, "When we were swimming and taking pictures of all the fish in the ocean." Lilly said, "it was epic. We did lots of fun stuff." Martha added, "it was amazing. It was so cool because I liked the sea monster and I liked the freezing."

MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH



Fr Simon writes:

It was a joy to be in school once again this past Monday to begin exploring with the children, in our Collective Worship, a new theme or value: 'Respect'. We began by trying to come up with a simple definition. We eventually decided that respect is about caring for or treating well those places, things and people we come into contact with. We'll continue digging deeper into the word, and its various dimensions and repercussions, over the next half-term.

As I prepared for the worship though, I had Aretha Franklin's 1967 hit 'Respect' going around in my head - particularly the 'R-E-S-P-E-C-T' chorus

with the backup singers' refrain of "Sock it to me, sock it to me, sock it to me...". Franklin's version of the song is a declaration from a strong, confident woman demanding 'respect'. It's a sad indictment of our society that, half a century later, during the past year's lockdown, reports of abuse of all sorts have soared.

This Sunday in church, we'll be celebrating God the Holy Trinity. That is: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Three persons in one God. It was the early 15th century icon painter Andrei Rublev who created the most famous attempt at portraying the mystery of the Holy Trinity - three in one, and one in three. But it's a reminder to us that even the essence of God is about a relationship... a relationship of mutual love, collaboration, and - yes - respect.

For those having a half-term break, I wish you a relaxing and fun time.
