Diamond Class Science - Air Resistance

FROM THE HEADTEACHER


Our week in school has been significantly impacted by the teacher strikes, with two consecutive strike days and I truly hope that these will be the last. Thank you for your understanding and the way that you have coped with the impact. I am pleased that, with SATs just after Easter, Diamond class have been able to continue their learning without interruption. I am also pleased that Sapphire class have been able to access most of their swimming programme, as water safety and confidence in water are very important for children to develop at as early an age as possible.

Science: Diamond class's science topic is forces and they have been investigating air resistance. They had to design a streamlined paper airplane from a single piece of paper. As a child, I loved making and throwing paper airplanes and many of our children share this enjoyment. It is not often that they get to do this safely in school whilst increasing their scientific knowledge. After folding their designs, they tested them. They then compared how far they had flown and discussed which characteristic of their plane were assisting in a long flight. After some tweaks, they retested and then began to write up the findings of their investigation.



Design and Technology: Design and technology involves learning skills as well as developing understanding of structures, mechanisms and techniques. Sapphire class are learning about box structures and how axels are used to enable wheels to turn. They are also learning to use a saw safely. At this stage it is with close adult assistance. By folding and gluing card to make a box shape, sawing the dowels that are used as axles and putting it all together, they created simple vehicles. Another aspect of design and technology is testing the designs and evaluating their work, so they tested whether the box structure supported the axle and whether the wheels moved.







Mini-Police: Year 5 have now completed their mini police programme and received their certificates. This week, they learned more about personal safety, road safety, bullying and antisocial behaviour as well as finding out more about the equipment that police officers use.





Craft Club: Craft Club has been running since Christmas. We began this club to provide additional after school options and this has been very popular. The children are enjoying making a whole range of arty items and learning different techniques. They made melted pictures and enjoyed seeing what happens to wax crayons and how they mix when an adult heats them up. They are now making papier maché masks. They have spent a couple of weeks creating the overall shapes by adding papier maché to a balloon, and now have painted them. Next week, they will start to cut out their mask and decorate it and I am

looking forward to seeing the finished projects. After Easter, this club will move to Mondays so that children who wish to attend both Craft Club and Gardening Club are able to

do so.

Mother's Day: Thank you to the PTA for providing a Mother's Day gift shop again. Children have been making Mother's day cards to say thank you for all the wonderful support and love they receive. We hope you enjoy them and will share some of the designs with you next week – no spoilers!



End of the Day: Just to clarify, we recently changed end of the day for **Ruby to 3.10** for safety reasons. **Sapphire Class finishes at 3.15, Emerald and Diamond finish at 3.20.** Please continue to take care in the car park and at the end of the day.

MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH



Father Simon writes:

This Sunday is always a highlight of our year at Great St Mary's because, whilst we're still in the purple days of Lent, it's also Mothering Sunday.

Mothering Sunday didn't start out as big business for the card manufacturers. Some believe its

origins are in the 16th century when, on the fourth Sunday of Lent, people would visit their 'mother church' - the church in which they were baptised. The story goes that, as children walked home along the country lanes to their parents after the services, they would pick wild flowers from the wayside as a gift for their mothers. So the day gradually became one associated not only with our mother church and with Jesus' mother Mary, but with



motherhood in general. And then, over the past century, inspired by America, we've seen the increased commercialisation of the day into what many now know as 'Mother's Day'.

That doesn't mean that the Church has forgotten the day's roots however. Whilst we're going to be celebrating all those who have been mothers or mothering-figures in our own personal lives, on Sunday we're also going to be giving thanks at Great St Mary's for the Church as the mother of our faith, and remembering Mary - Jesus' mother - being the mother of God's family: the Church.



And so to celebrate, we're going to be giving out plants donated by the Mothers' Union at the end of our 9.30am service this Sunday morning to all those in mothering roles. And after the service, over coffee, we'll be enjoying another tradition for this Sunday: simnel cake. It's a delicious fruitcake decorated with marzipan including a set of eleven

marzipan balls representing Jesus' twelve apostles minus his betrayer - Judas Iscariot.

And then, at 4pm on Sunday afternoon, we've got our monthly 'Mustard Seed' gathering which will feature crafts,

activities and food on the theme of Mothering Sunday.

As always, it will be a joy to see you in Great St Mary's... all are welcome.






