Easter Egg Hunt

FROM THE HEADTEACHER

What a lot of fun the children have been having today. The PTA organised an Easter Egg Hunt and despite the rain, the Easter Bunny was there on drop-off, greeting them and posing for photos with the children. The younger ones loved it and the older ones enjoyed showing that they were too cool and grown up for it. The classes still got out for their egg hunts, mostly avoiding the heavy rain and they had a lot of fun doing so. All of the children have brought home an Easter treat from the PTA.

Children also received their homework certificates. We gave out a lot of Gold ones this time. Thank you to parents for supporting this. Regular practise of key skills makes such a difference to the children and we have seen a very positive impact, particularly on reading from the increased focus at home from so many of you. We have also seen some fantastic project work.



On Wednesday, the Emerald class parents joined us for a presentation of the class's recent learning. The children shared a great deal of knowledge from all different areas of the curriculum. Parents heard that in their science topics, the children had learned all about sound. Using instruments, they had explored pitch and volume, and how sound is made by vibrations.

They also thoroughly enjoyed showing the body percussion that they had worked on together. They informed us that they had explored the musical concept of a canon and that the sound they would make with their bodies would also move like a sound wave from side to side and from front to back. They rubbed hands, clapped and stamped and performed so well together.

Children also shared from their other science topic: growth, and how they'd investigated the conditions that plants need for growth by setting up a controlled experiment with sunflower seeds where they included or excluded a number of conditions that they thought were required for growth such as water, sunlight, air and space. They shared their findings, including a colourless plant that had grown without light.





They shared some lovely artwork that they had created with watercolours that was inspired by the work of Claude Monet, and this also had a plant theme.

They also talked about their Anglo Saxon history topic,

shared some information about the way people lived in England at that time and recalled their experiences from the West Stow visit.

The children sang a song in French, all about different animals and if we did not know all the French words, the actions helped us to understand.



It was great to see how much the children are learning and how they are benefitting from the whole curriculum. It was itself a valuable learning experience, having the opportunity to perform in front of an audience and develop confidence by doing so, even if it was made easier by having such an appreciative and supportive audience.



On Thursday, the whole school and a large proportion of the parents enjoyed a lovely Easter service at Great St Mary's Church led by Father Simon. The older children's readings took us through the Easter Story and the songs that were beautifully sang and the prayers from each class enabled the story to be further reflected on. One of the more reflective songs, "When I think about the Cross' was sang beautifully and thoughtfully by even the youngest children and provided a special moment of poignant reflection. The children equally enjoyed the more up tempo songs, such as 'Sing out an Easter Song' with the resounding shout at the end – He's Alive, which made Father Simon jump.

New Uniform Policy: The governors have updated the uniform policy (attached). We would like all parents to look at it and work with us towards consistency. The PE kit, in particular is something we are aiming for more consistency with, however we would not expect parents to buy new items immediately. We will therefore wait to enforce this policy until the new school year but would appreciate it if you adhere to it as you replace your child's clothing. Please also remember that labelling items makes it so much easier to return lost property.

School Bags: Another change we need to work towards is the carrying of large bags. Most children have very little other than their books and reading records inside and these bags take up a lot of space, are difficult to keep on the pegs. We have also seen bottles inside bags leaking and damaging the books.

We would therefore like to see book bags only (except when PE or swimming kit are brought in and they should be in a drawstring bag), as these are much more easily stored in school and keep the books in good condition. Water bottles should still be brought in daily.

What a busy but very productive term this has been and after a break, we will all be ready for a great summer term and the challenges and opportunities it brings.


MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH

Fr Simon writes:

It was a joy to welcome pupils, teachers, parents, carers, and governors to Great St Mary's yesterday afternoon for our end of term Easter service - even if the batteries did run out of the sound unit in the final song, curtailing our singing a little prematurely!

Having heard the wonderful singing and reading, all telling the story of what happened to a bloke named Jesus 2000 years ago, I explored for a few moments why this no doubt very inspirational, wise, good guy is still worth talking and singing about two millennia later.





I pointed out that there's very good contemporary evidence from both within and outside of the Bible to bear witness to Jesus' death and Easter rising to new life. And, after all, if it was all a lie, a fix, all the trickery of a bad man, why would those who knew him so well also be prepared to lose their own lives in the decades after Jesus' time on earth - often in horrific ways - as they went around telling others all they knew about Jesus? As they say: nobody is surely fool enough to die for something they know to be a lie.

So, if it is all true, then we need to sit up and take notice because it means than what Jesus and others said about him may well be true: that he really is the Son of God who, forty days after Easter, ascended back to live in heaven with God our Father, and continues to love us from there.

But so what? Even if Jesus is the Son of God, why does he still matter to us 2000 years later when we've got all we need for a comfortable life?


Well, during his time living in and around Jerusalem, Jesus spoke a lot about what will happen to us after our lives in the here and now come to an end. He made it clear that death isn't the end; that this is only the beginning of our lives lived in the company of God.

Jesus talked about his Easter resurrection - that moment when he came back to life - being the moment - the proof - which unlocks the gates to eternal everlasting life for all those who believe in him.

And so the reason Christians celebrate Easter is because it's the moment - as important to us today as it ever was - when Jesus showed us what glories and joys lie ahead for us depending how we live our lives now.

So as we come to the end of this term and you all head off on your Easter break, I hope and pray that you'll not only be able to relax and have fun (and enjoy a satisfying amount of Easter eggs!), but that you'll also find a moment or two to reflect on what the Easter story still means for each one of us. It may be the most important thing you ever do!


