FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Ruby Class: Ruby Class have been drawing outside in the sunshine. They have been designing sun hats. They have also been learning about brushing their teeth. The children talked about how important it is to brush their teeth twice a day and for two minutes each time. They have also had great fun giving the dinosaurs a spa.







Sapphire Class: During their Religious Education lessons, Sapphire Class are learning about sacred texts and considering the messages in some of the stories and how these stories can guide the way that believers behave. This week, the children have been learning about an Old Testament story, David and Goliath. They enjoyed reenacting the story using stick puppets. They really got into the characters. They thought about how brave David had been and how he had trusted God to look after him.



Emerald Class are learning about electricity. They were connecting circuits and making sure that the wires connected the battery and components correctly. They had to light up a bulb and make a motor spin. They now understand the importance of a complete and correctly connected circuit and that the batteries need to work.







Aspects Crucial Crew: Y6 joined another local school for the Crucial Crew afternoon on Thursday. The aim of the session was to prepare the children for transition to secondary school by increasing their awareness how to keep themselves safe. They were involved in many different activities, led by different services and each provided an opportunity to gain understanding that will help them with future decision making.

- Paramedics showed them how to deal with emergency situations including clearing an area of danger and putting someone into the recovery position.
- Network Rail representatives helped them to think about safely crossing railways, including showing them video footage of some motorists who clearly had not followed the rules.
- Herts. Fire Brigade took them through an activity to identify the fire hazards in a room and the children rose to the competitive challenge of this.
- British Transport Police taught them about the lines on the edge of a platform and how it is textured for people with visual impairments and why it is so important to stay behind the lines as trains approach and go past.
- Other activities included water safety, how to respond to peer pressure and an illustration of how vulnerable young people are if they walk along using their mobile phones and sending texts, as they are not paying sufficient attention to their surroundings.

The children were then taken to see the police vans and informed that from the age of ten, children are considered responsible for knowing the difference between right and wrong and for making the right choices. They were then all put in the van to experience what this is like. They thoroughly enjoyed this as well as using a metal detector, wearing helmets and putting handcuffs on each other. What a packed, instructive and enjoyable afternoon this was.







The Yellow Book: Back in October 2022 the project to create the Sawbridgeworth Primary Yellow Book involving five local schools was launched. Throughout the school, an art project titled "I feel better when" took place, with each class teacher choosing a different style for their class to use to express their ideas. From these lovely pieces of work, two were shortlisted from each year group to be put forwards for consideration. The final selection has now taken place and each school has ten works of art



that will feature in the published book. When the book is published, each child in the school will receive a copy (funded by EHDC). The chosen works are all here, as is some information about the assessors.

HGVs using the A1184 through Sawbridgeworth for access to the site in St. James' Park: Thank you to so many parents for responding. Over 50 parents have expressed their objection to the proposal to allow the HGVs to use this road. Included in the responses were some very useful comments about the current issues with congestion, noise, pollution, the condition of the road and child safety, and how these will only become even more problematic. I will be lodging my concerns today and will be informing the council of the level of concern we share. Additionally, the Governing Body have prepared a very detailed letter explaining their objections. A copy of this is attached. MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH

Father Simon writes:

Busy preparations are underway for this Sunday afternoon's *Mustard Seed* gathering our monthly moment for youngsters which includes crafts, activities, worship, and food. It's certainly always great fun and one of my highlights of the month.



This Sunday we're going to be celebrating Ascension Day which remembers that moment, forty days after his

Easter resurrection, when Jesus, in front of his bewildered followers, bid them farewell and ascended back to be with his Father in heaven. So, I'm looking forward to seeing what crafts and activities are put together because there are so many visual images in the biblical accounts. The only thing I've said is that, for my money, helium balloons in church are a no-no.

Whilst I've seen Jesus' Ascension celebrated to good and memorable effect in the past with fireworks sent up into the heavens, I've also seen helium-filled balloons let off in church to symbolise Jesus ascending upwards. Putting to one side any environmental concerns, the problem comes when 'Jesus' hits the church ceiling or vault. We then have a symbol of Jesus not ascending back to heaven but trapped by the Church and well out of the reach of anybody to help 'him' down!!



Several weeks later, the idea of getting the churchwardens to quietly shoot 'Jesus' down with an air rifle was quickly dismissed, and so, well into the summer months, a rather sad looking 'Jesus' was still up in the church rafters, occasionally gently rocking when somebody opened the church door and let in a little summer breeze.

And then came the Sunday, well into the autumn, when we arrived in church to find

that the helium had finally escaped or lost its ascending power, and a rather sad, deflated balloon was lying forlornly on the church floor. On seeing the balloon, one particular young child was heard to remark, 'Look, Jesus has come back down.' It was a case of symbolism, from start to finish, going badly wrong!



So no helium balloons at *Mustard Seed* this Sunday afternoon but we'll no doubt have great fun marking this culmination of Jesus' life on earth and his present status in heaven as, as King Charles himself acknowledged at the beginning of his coronation service, the King of kings and Lord of lords. So do come and join us - starting at Great St Mary's this Sunday at 4pm.




