

Diamond Class Adventure Week

FROM THE HEADTEACHER

This week Diamond Class have thoroughly enjoyed their adventure week. In order to keep costs down for parents, instead of going to an outdoor residential centre, we organised a locally based adventure experience over four days and one night.

On Tuesday and Wednesday the children enjoyed two action packed days at the Edge Outdoors in Ware. They took part in high ropes, zip-wire, climbing, mountain boarding (giant skate boards on which the children hurtle down a grassy slope, often ending in a heap or slightly lost in the long grass!), air rifle shooting, archery, laser tag and Zorb Strike (climbing inside a giant plastic ball and running around crashing into everyone else who is also in a giant plastic ball!!) as well as some problem solving team activities, one of which challenged them to protect an egg using a range of materials so that when it was dropped from a great height, it remained intact.

On Thursday the children enjoyed a local walk (which some thought was going to be a very long way, and although it was quite far, they managed very well, if you ignore the complaints), camping on the school field (which included setting up tents, bringing enough clothes to last a week and waking up as soon as the sun started to shine), a barbeque (which after all the effort was thoroughly enjoyed), a campfire (with some silly songs, marshmallows and hot chocolate) and lots of fun.



On Friday they went kayaking and canoeing to end the week with a splash.

So, as you might imagine, the children have had an absolutely

fantastic week and demonstrated a massive range of positive attributes not the least of which were resilience, courage, determination, supportiveness, teamwork and a can-do attitude that in many cases surprised even themselves.

We are trusting they catch up on lost sleep over the weekend and half term and are confident that the adults who were with them, will certainly hope to do the same.

Sam: "I loved when we slept in the tents. We said jokes and it was really fun."

Bobby: "The best thing is to conquer your fears and to not be scared and give it a go."

Emerald Class have been building on their prior learning about electricity by troubleshooting circuits that just aren't working. They had to identify the fault and then say how to correct it.



Sapphire Class have been developing some of the skills and learning to play tennis and have enjoyed using the nets we recently bought to go in the MUGA. A big well done to Year 2 for doing their best whilst working independently on their assessment tasks for the SATS.

Ruby Class have been very busy, as usual. Their maths focus this week has been shapes and they have been making some super shape pictures, identifying the different shapes they have used.


