## FROM THE HEADTEACHER

It was lovely to be back in school after the half term, gearing up for a busy and hopefully sunny Summer. This week, the children in Ruby and Sapphire enjoyed drama sessions with Perform Drama. They had a Peter Pan adventure workshop. They took part in drama games related to being the Peter Pan characters. They copied certain actions and when commands were called, they had to show the motif of that character. They had guessing games to see if they knew what emotion different children were showing relating to events in the story. They showed parts of the story using freeze frame and acted as if they were trying to steal Captain Hook's treasure. They had to sneak around his pirate ship and freeze whenever he turned around. Then, working together they chose poses and positions to produce a still photo of a pirate ship. The children had a lot of fun and demonstrated how well they could follow instructions and use their imagination and bodies.



**Respect:** Our new Christian Value is Respect and this week's focus was remembering to pray for others. Father Simon taught the children the hand prayer. Each finger represents people that they could pray for. Some of the children created their own illustrations as they reflected on this.





**September Staffing:** I am now in a position to provide information about changes that we are planning for September. I am still looking for a teaching assistant to join us as Miss Lucus can only be with us until the end of this term, but apart from that we now have clarity about the structure.

We will be welcoming Mrs McDonald back from her maternity at the start of July and she will be with us for four days each week. I am really pleased that Mrs Todd, who originally joined us to cover maternity, is now a permanent member of the team. Mrs Cook's role is also changing. She will not have full-time class responsibility but will continue to share her deep understanding of teaching Year 5 and 6 as well as teaching one day a week in Sapphire. She will also be able to have a wider impact on the teaching and learning throughout the school and Mrs Cook and I will be able to work together on ensuring that the school goes from strength to strength in all areas. #### **MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH**

#### Father Simon writes:



Last Sunday morning, members of our Sunday Club were getting suitably muddy and wet - albeit in beautiful sunshine - planting seeds, bulbs, and bedding plants which, over the next few months, will no doubt blossom and bring much joy



to many who pass through the churchyard and see our Rainbow Garden. If you're passing, do stop, take a seat, and enjoy the sight, perhaps with a drink or sandwich to hand.

As Christians, we're called to be good stewards of the world God has created. However, we know from the many news reports of environmental tragedies, beautifully filmed documentaries by the likes of Sir David Attenborough, and increasing commentary from the likes of Swedish activist Greta Thunberg, that we're failing badly in this task.





At the beginning of the

second chapter of the book of Genesis we're told that on the seventh day God rested from all the work he had done in creating the universe, a creation that he himself saw as 'good'. What we're now doing to that creation is therefore at great odds to its goodness. The accumulation of our many small actions - let alone the impact of our industries - will almost certainly have eschatological consequences for both humanity and wildlife around the globe.

It's for that reason that the Church of England committed itself in 2020 to carbon neutrality by 2030. Like similar commitments made by other organisations and industries, it's hugely ambitious. However, we're only going to limit the most extreme effects of climate change if we, as nations, councils, organisations, and individuals, meet such challenging commitments. That's why the PCC of Great St Mary's has also adopted a resolution to play our part: to also commit to achieving net-zero carbon emissions by 2030, and to identify and address wider environmental impacts across all of our activities.



The effects of climate change are no longer theoretical. Increasingly, they are real and dramatic. Whether

from governments, organisations, industries or individuals, good words are no longer adequate. We must turn those words into actions and attend to those actions with urgency. Only then will we, as Christians, be able to turn to God and, with honesty, be able to raise, in the words of the poet and hymnwriter Folliott Pierpoint, a joyful hymn of praise 'for the beauty of the earth, for the beauty of the skies, for the love which, from our birth, over and around us lies.'



**ORAL HEALTH FOR CHILDREN** 

#### WHAT IS TOOTH DECAY?

The hard outer surface of a tooth is broken down or damaged by bacteria and acid making holes in the teeth, called cavities. It can cause pain and infections, and cause problems with eating, speaking, playing, learning, smiling and socialising. Tooth decay occurs when foods and drinks with sugars and starches are left on the teeth.

#### REDUCE THE RISK OF TOOTH DECAY

- Take your child to the dentist when their first milk teeth appear
- Brush teeth twice a day with fluoride toothpaste - no rinsing
- Support children under 7 with brushing
  Children should see a dentist yearly at least
- Children should have fluoride varnish at each visit (which is free)

#### TOP TIPS 😽

- Brush teeth in the morning and at bedtime for 2 minutes with fluoride toothpaste
- Use a pea-sized amount of toothpaste
  Spit out after brushing and don't
- rinse, otherwise the fluoride won't work as well
  Fizzy drinks, fruit juices and sugary
- Fizzy drinks, fruit juices and sugary snacks should be limited to mealtimes

#### Ready, Set, Read! Summer Reading Challenge 2023

Hertfordshire Library Service is delighted to announce Ready, Set, Read! - the Summer Reading Challenge 2023.

Designed to keep children reading over the summer holidays, the Summer Reading Challenge is a fun, free activity that broadens reading horizons, improves mental well-being, encourages a healthy reading habit, and helps to maintain reading levels ready for the start of the next academic year.

Children are encouraged to read six library books of their choice during the school holiday, returning to their local library to share what they have been reading with staff and volunteers. Each participant receives a themed folder and is awarded stickers for every book they read. Children who complete the challenge are presented with a certificate, a medal and a special finishing gift.

**Ready, Set, Read!** is presented by The Reading Agency in partnership with the Youth Sport Trust, and delivered by libraries across the UK. The theme for 2023 focuses on participation in shared sports and activities and aims to keep children's minds and bodies active.

It is free for children to join the library and to take part in the Summer Reading Challenge.

Ready, Set, Read! packs will be available in all 46 Hertfordshire libraries from Saturday 8 July.
