FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Outdoor Learning Day: Knowing how capricious the weather can be, it is perhaps no surprise that the day we'd chosen for our outdoor learning day turned out to be one of the wettest in recent weeks. This day was something we planned way back in the autumn term when we had a review of well being and children told us that they would love more opportunities to learn outside. The intention was to test out a number of ideas and also to provide a day for the children to work in mixed age groups, something we have not done so much of recently.

So, with a few adjustments and a hope for better weather in the afternoon, the day commenced. The day consisted of five activities that the children took part in. Each group included children from Nursery up to Year 6. The mixed age collaboration days promote belonging in the school community, encourage children to work with others than their usual group and provide the opportunity for that super level of support that our children love to give to those younger than themselves.

The day included activities that encourage creativity, focus, independence and teamwork. Recent training we have accessed on wellbeing, focused on the benefits that children gain when problem solving with other children, whilst the adults take a step back, allowing them to work things through together. The den building, in particular, aimed to do this and after a safety briefing, the children just got on with it (apart from asking for some of the bigger branches to be cut in half by Mr Priestley).

The five activities were:

1. Making dream catchers



2. Observational drawing and texture rubbings



3. Making musical instruments from recycled bottles and natural materials,



4. Creating pictures by pounding an imprint of plants onto fabric



5. Den building.



The day ended with a whole school assembly with children from each group sharing their work and talking about what they had gained and enjoyed.

Some enjoyed the close attention to detail in the drawing and dream catchers, others the experience of working with different materials and techniques, particularly the leaf and plant 'bashing', some the use of natural naturals and the fun of making lots of noise with their instruments and others the physicality of the den building with the opportunity to give their den a theme or specific style by adding leaves, camouflage and in one case creating a seating area outside, complete with fire pit and marshmallow toasting forks.

It was clear, when every child put their thumbs up, that they had experienced a great day. The range of activities had something for everyone, and the creative and collaborative aspects enabled all of the children to experience success.

There were immediate requests to do this again and no doubt we will. Thanks to Miss Green and Mrs Le Duc for planning this and for all the adults including Mr Priestley for their hard work.

I am looking forward to seeing lots of you here on Saturday for the Summer Fair.

MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH

Father Simon writes:

This Sunday's gospel reading at Great St Mary's contains an intriguing statement from Jesus: "Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me." [Matthew 10:40]





So, it seems, whoever welcomes me as a Christian into their life, also welcomes Jesus into their life. And whoever welcomes Jesus, welcomes the one who sent Jesus, namely God. I'm sure you'll agree, that's a lot of responsibility on Christian shoulders as we welcome others, and others welcome us!

What's more, Jesus doesn't set any borders or boundaries for this level of inclusion and welcome. It's about showing respect - our current collective worship theme - both to our neighbour and the stranger.

But it can seem so countercultural - both countercultural perhaps to our own personal comfort levels and to the policies enforced by nations and states all around the world. Indeed, am I being too cynical in suggesting it seems countercultural to the very nature of humanity?



After all, it seems far more engaging - perhaps at times even more exciting - to watch the clearcut clashes and conflicts of tribes or individuals than to bother to explore the subtleties of an argument or issue. It's the mindset which fuels so much of the 'them vs us' traffic on social media. There may often be legitimate and compelling reasons to consider the impact of such black or white issues, but if an inhospitable,

exclusive attitude is unnecessarily embedded within so many of the stories which swirl around us, then it shows how out of step we might be with Jesus' teaching, who so often talked about the importance of welcome, inclusion, and hospitality.

So where's our witness to welcoming others, and therefore welcoming into all our lives Jesus and the one who sent him? What does it look like in our lives, in our school, in our community, in our national policies, in our very attitudes?

Jesus didn't say that we have to agree on everything, but he pretty clearly told us to be welcoming. And, as the biblical author of the letter to the Hebrews reminds us, when we welcome strangers, we may well be entertaining angels unaware!


