Harvest Service: On Monday, the whole school travelled down to Great St Mary's Church for our Harvest Service. We use a coach, and it takes two trips to fit everyone in and some of the younger children love the excitement of getting on a coach. I am so pleased to see the large number of parents that join us for our services now (we virtually fill the church) and the staff and I relish these opportunities to come together with you the wider Spellbrook family. Father Simon regularly reminds us that Great St Mary's Church is our church. As the linked school, we gain so much when we are able to come together sharing our Values and aspirations for the children.




The Harvest Service was very enjoyable. The preparation by the teachers and children was very evident in the beautifully read bible texts and the Creation Poem that was shared by members of the worship team and other pupils from Diamond and Emerald classes. The children from Sapphire and Ruby Classes are developing their



confidence in coming to the front and they shared poems and prayers that they have written. Father Simon with some volunteers helped us to think about the word Harvest and how the letters can be used to spell earth, serve and heart and this helps us appreciate the meaning of this festival. The Harvest songs that remind us of all that we should be thankful for were beautifully sung.

It was lovely to see all of the items for the local Food Bank in the combined donation from the congregation of Great St Mary's Church, the pupils and parents from Fawbert and Barnard Infant's School and the donations from our own pupils and parents. We know these items will be greatly appreciated and will help out those in need in our local area.

Beautiful Artwork: Emerald Class's science topic is all about rocks. There are art links with the topic and the children have been developing the skills to draw different types of rock. A few weeks ago, they learned how to make a 2-dimensional drawing appear to have depth. They have now applied these skills and worked with water colours, pastels and paper to create these truly dramatic mixed-media images of Stonehenge.







Yellow Book Music Recording: On Wednesday morning, a small number of Sapphire and Diamond children joined a collective of other local schools at High Wych primary to sing and record a music video for the Yellow Book project. They all came together to record parts of a song that is being used for a national project on gratitude. The children sang lines to a new song, learned sign actions for their part, jointly clapped a rhythm, and spoke about the things they are thankful for. As per expectations, their behaviour was exceptional and together with the other children, they sounded beautiful.

WWII News

Diamond Class have

been using the knowledge they have gained in their World War II History topic to produce authentic looking news sheets. They watched videos and had discussions to find out how the war began, then considered what it would have been like to be a journalist at that time. They used the formats and photographs on the Purple Mash app and put together their reports. Writing for different purposes is part of the English curriculum and producing digital documents, part computing. When the different areas of learning such as history, English and computing come together, it enables the children to explore their understanding and apply skills in a meaningful context, making learning both more memorable and more enjoyable.

MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH

Father Simon writes:

Overflowing love

Amy Carmichael (1867–1951) was an Irish Christian missionary in India who opened an orphanage and founded a mission in Dohnavur in southern India. There she served for 55 years and wrote 35 books about her work as a missionary. This is an excerpt from her book 'Edges of His Ways' (SPCK 1955).



In Tamil, we have a polite word which tells someone who asks for something that we have run short of it; that we have nothing to give. That word is 'Poochiam'.

One day, I felt like saying Poochiam about love; I had run short of it. I was in the Forest, and I had just read a letter that was hard to answer lovingly. I was sitting by The Pool at the time, and presently began to watch the water flow down through the deep channel worn in the smooth rocks above it. There was always inflow, so there was always outflow. Never for one minute did the water cease to flow in, and never for one moment did it cease to flow out; and I knew, of course, that the water that flowed out was the water that flowed in. The hollow that we called The Pool had no water of its own, and yet all the year round there was an overflow.



God hath not given you the spirit of fear... but of love.

If love flows in, love will flow out. Let love flow in. That was the word of The Pool. There is no need for any of us to run short of love. We need never say Poochiam.
