Ruby Class Bonfire: With well-established routines to keep the children safe and ensure they had a great time, Ruby class enjoyed their annual bonfire in the woodland area. They looked at the fire and saw how it burned down, and enjoyed songs, sparklers and marshmallows.

The children were ever so patient as they waited for their sparkler. The sparklers were skewered into a piece of fruit to make them easier to hold as they waved them around to make various shapes in the air. They all understood the routines and rules that made sure they were safe.





They enjoyed marshmallows that were toasted for them and were all careful to wait until they'd cooled enough to eat.

They said the marshmallows were gigantic like the gigantic turnip and one loudly exclaimed that this was the best day ever. Thank you to Mr Priestley for making and tending the bonfire. **Sapphire Class Train Ride:** Sapphire Class recreated a train in the classroom to help with their new writing unit "The train ride". They participated in different roles as the conductor and the train driver. They watched clips of views from trains, discussing all the sight and sounds they could see. They then used drama to explore the train ride experience, encouraging excitement about every stage (e.g. buying tickets, taking seats, setting off). Their "trains" then went outside. They had to navigate round bends, stop at signals for other trains to pass and learn how to reverse and move in the opposite direction. The children had so much fun!



Chess Club: There hasn't been a chess club at Spellbrook for a number of years and this week, a lunchtime club began. As so many children showed an interest, those with prior experience were the first to begin, playing friendly matches to check their knowledge of the different moves. They all played well, concentrated on their matches.

Quite a few talked about playing at home and being taught the moves by parents. These more experienced players have volunteered to share their knowledge with others who are less skilled or have never played. Therefore, over the next few weeks, a beginners and more advanced group will be established to provide opportunities to practise and develop



skills at this great game of strategic thinking and planning. We may even be looking for external opponents next year, to test our skills against.

Eco Action Team: Our Eco Action Team have been busy litter picking around the site. Armed with gloves, litter pickers and plastic bags, they enjoy getting busy and making the grounds look good. They are also keen to identify which of the items can be recycled. Well done to them.



MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH

Father Simon writes:

Our view of a monarch and their sovereignty has changed over the years. In the past - and I'm talking a good few centuries ago now - our monarch had 'hard power': the ability to wage economic and/or military battle against opposing forces, be they inside or outside the country.







These days though, we view our current sovereign as having a 'soft power' which can be used gently to curry favour with foreign leaders and governments for the benefit of our national interests. Such power's been on display this past week as King Charles and Queen Camilla welcomed the president of South Korea to Buckingham Palace for a state banquet.

However, the concept of power - once so appealing - still raises concerns and has difficult connotations today. The

'Black Lives Matter' movement, for instance, points to power being used to supress and exploit people, the environmental movement reminds us continually of how the powers of industrialisation and economic growth are threatening our world, and we're aware of both historical and current demagogues and dictators rising to power and then manipulating their power for evil doing.

Over the centuries, there have tragically been many in the global Church who have also abused their positions of power and influence. For their actions and the ongoing consequences for innocent victims, the Church - Jesus' flock - continues to feel betrayed and deeply ashamed. It continues to apologise, even as further tragic crimes around the globe come to light involving the Church and those in its positions of influence, just as light continues to be shed on allegations and crimes in so many other areas of society.





Such deep and scandalous wounds - both physical and psychological will tragically never properly be healed in those survivors who've suffered through no fault of their own. As the worldwide Church explores Christ's kingship in services this weekend, all those of us who truly follow the King of Love can do, in whose name such evil has so often been perpetrated, is to empower love and goodness in our communities and in our relationships. By doing so, we're modelling Jesus himself who, as sovereign over creation, taught and displayed the true way to utilise

power for good: by teaching and displaying love, compassion, truth, beauty, kindness, and peace.
