FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Having had a restful half term break, we are now back for the second part of Spring Term. We have started a new Value, Justice and have begun to think about what it means. During Collective Worship on Monday, Father Simon helped us to think about treating others fairly. This links well to our Golden Rule, "In everything - in every circumstance - do to others as you would have them do to you."

We have continued to consider what helps us to judge what is right. The children have been thinking about rules and also considering how their conscience guides them.




Diamond Class were very fortunate to have a visit from a local magistrate. She explained a great deal about the justice system and helped them to expand their

understanding of some of the laws of our country. She was intrigued with the number of different crimes they could name. She explained the role of a magistrate and the different type of courts and how they operate. It was fascinating and enlightening. Some were surprised to discover that ten is the age of criminal responsibility.

Meanwhile, a group of keen mathematicians from Y5/6 have taken part in the 2024 Hertfordshire Maths Challenge. This year 260 schools have taken part and a number of overseas schools joined in. In our heat there was one from Milan and another from Gibraltar.



The children had to work together to solve a number of complex problems within a given time. They worked well together and had some good strategies with different members of the team solving different parts of the problem then combining their knowledge for a complete



answer. It would be great to get through to the final but as only the top 20 schools qualify, it is an ambitious hope. The children have certainly enjoyed the experience and enjoyed working together on something novel and challenging.

Ruby Class have been very excited to see that their beans have germinated and now have roots and shoots. They used magnifiers to look carefully and identify the different parts. They have now planted them and are hoping they will grow tall and strong.





Next Thursday is World Book Day. Last year, it was lovely to see lots of staff and children taking part and dressing up and it would be super to see if this year, the whole school could take part.

Children can dress as their favourite book character or alternatively they can come to school as a 'reader' dressed in their own clothes with a book.

Don't forget that children are also being asked to design a character using part of an egg box. The full details are on a message sent out on ClassDojo on the 13th of February and in the flyer below.

MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH

Father Simon writes:

'Gentle Jesus, meek and mild'. So wrote Charles Wesley in the 18th century, penning the start of just one of his 6,500 or so hymns.

If we want an antidote for that image, we can do no better than to turn to our Gospel reading this Sunday. It's St John's account of Jesus cleansing the Temple in Jerusalem. Driving out the money-changers with a whip of cords, he then pours out their coins and overturns their tables before shouting after them: "Stop making my Father's house a market-place!"

The reading comes at a very interesting time because the national Church press has been debating the use of our church and cathedral buildings.



It's as a result of Canterbury Cathedral - the mother church of all England holding two 'silent discos' in the cathedral's nave earlier in the month. In the words of the convenor of a petition which has gained several thousand signatures against the events, the cathedral hosted these "alcohol-fuelled" discos with guests listening through headphones to the music of the 1990s ranging from popstar Britney Spears to rapper Eminem, only feet away from the site of the martyrdom of St Thomas Becket. "This was to be a purely profane event. In place of the cross, we have a DJ elevated with arms

outstretched as if in mimicry, towering over the multitude of revellers, who though gathered together, each separately listen to their pop music via their own headphones, atomised by technology."





This isn't the first time a church or cathedral has hosted such an event, and, in the months ahead, other silent discos are planned in a number of cathedrals including our own diocesan cathedral of St Albans. As Ben Phillips, a researcher in music, religion, and culture, wrote in an essay for *'The Critic'* magazine last week: "Few are discussing why many of our cathedrals host these events. The reason is not missiological or ecclesiological; it isn't about relevance or 'community' either. It's about having the funds to keep the doors open." With visitor numbers down since Brexit and the pandemic, the running costs of St Albans Cathedral per day, for instance, currently stand at £6,000.

It's a lively debate and one which we'll have to engage in here in Sawbridgeworth as we consider the re-ordering of our church over the next few years so as to reach out to our wider community.

Great St Mary's has been our town's house of prayer for over 800 years. Whilst the plans currently being drawn up for the church's re-ordering are primarily intended to provide a more flexible space within the church so as to host a wider range of events as we face the fact that it currently costs us £540 per day for the church to remain viable, we also have to recognise both the heritage and holiness of our sacred building.
