
FROM THE HEADTEACHER

World Book Day 2024 has been a lot of fun. Staff dressed up and during drop-off this morning the children were greeted by the Queen of Hearts and Gandalf. Nearly all the children dressed up as book characters or as a reader in comfortable clothes, with a favourite book.

Thank you to all of the families for supporting the children and helping them to take part.

Characters included many different Hogwarts attendees and traditional story favourites such as Alice, Dorothy and Mary Poppins and Tigger.







There were characters we have not seen before: Percy Jackson, Gangsta Granny, Billionaire Kid and a couple of Wednesdays. We even had Stan Lee, the Marvel comic book writer, actor and producer.

The children thoroughly enjoyed

seeing each other's costumes during our whole school assembly. During the day, each class had a secret reader where they stopped what they were doing to enjoy a story from an adult other than their teacher. Ruby Class enjoyed reading and sharing their favourite books, particularly when their book contained their dressing up character.



Diamond Class viewed a live World Book Day lesson on reading, authors and illustration.

MC Grammer, who the children saw at Young Voices, also performed a new World Book Day Rap, called, "Reading is Amazing", during which the children tried to count the number of books mentioned.

Egg Box Characters: As part of the preparation for the day, children were challenged to make book characters, book scenes or book covers out of egg boxes. They have shown great creativity, and we have some super works of art from every class. It has been an excellent day, and we will build on the momentum when we have a visit from an author, Steve Clifford, who has written the "Walking With" series of novels, at the end of this half term.
