Sponsored Walk: A little while ago, inspired by the links that Great St. Mary's Church has forged, our School Council decided to find out more about the wonderful work carried out by the educational charity *Shiksha Rath*, whose aim is to provide a safe, enriching environment for the children in the Outram slums of northern Delhi, India. Shiksha Rath is an after-school project which provides education and life-skills to

ensure that these children do not fall behind their peers, due to their lack of privilege and access to a quality education.

The School Council contacted Shiksha Rath to find out how Spellbrook School might help, and their most immediate need is to find more child sponsors, to pay for a child's tuition and educational needs, as well as the costs of uniform and stationary.

As a result, this week, the whole school got behind the aim by taking part in a sponsored walk. The plan that the School Council came up with, was to work as a school to walk the equivalent number of miles as climbing Shiksha Rath

to the top of the tallest mountain in India 50 times. Approximately 267 miles altogether! Wow! What a challenge.

The children walked around our field many, many times on Wednesday afternoon. The older children walked as far as four miles with the youngest ones managing about a mile. By the end, there were many tired children, but they were very pleased to have taken part. We will now collect the sponsor money and hopefully will have enough to sponsor a child for the year.

MESSAGE FROM GREAT ST MARY'S CHURCH

Father Simon writes:

It strikes me that, when we're faced with a new challenge, there are three types of people. There are those, whether fearful or not of what lies ahead, who will dive headlong straight into something just to get on with it. They don't mind breaking the odd egg or two to make an omelette. Then there are those who like to be prepared who will start at the shallow end, putting just a toe into the water so as to get used to the temperature before gently and slowly submerging themselves further. Then there are those who don't want to go anywhere near the pool for fear of what might lie ahead.





Do you recognise yourself somewhere in this? No doubt psychologists would say it's far more nuanced than that, but, as the vicar of Sawbridgeworth, I do notice people's interaction with our beautiful Grade-1-listed church of Great St Mary's is usually somewhere on that scale. It continues to surprise me how many people who've lived in Sawbridgeworth for many decades will come to an event or service and tell me quietly that it's their first time in the building. No doubt a large part of that is the church's fault. Over time we haven't seemed necessary, approachable, or relevant to people's lives. That's why, as part of our exploration of the church estate, and how we use it and make it most fit for the needs of our local community, we've been consulting widely. But another reason, I think, is that, if you haven't engaged with something after a certain period - a project, a place, a person, an opportunity - there comes a point when, to engage becomes a daunting prospect; in our minds we build the molehill into a mountain.

Well, I'm hoping that this Sunday afternoon might be an opportunity for those who haven't crossed the threshold of Great St Mary's for a while - or even ever - to reduce the size of that mountain. That's because this Sunday, between 12 and 4pm, we're part of the annual **Sawbridgeworth May Fayre**.



As well as everything else of interest going on around the town, there will be plenty of things of interest in and around Great St Mary's: **donkey rides** in the churchyard, an exhibition of some of the church's **beautiful historical artefacts** in the church, a **church tour at 1.30pm**, and a **churchyard tour at 2.30pm** charting the history of Sawbridgeworth through the names of some of the important people who have lived or been connected with our town over the centuries.

There will be the opportunity to climb up to the church's **bellringing chamber** and **ring a bell or two**. And, for those who don't want to go up the tower, the bellringers are offering budding ringers the opportunity to try their hand on a mini ringing-frame set up in the churchyard.



And if that's not enough, there's going to be a **Teddy Zip Wire** rigged from the top of the church tower so that brave and willing cuddly toys can be hoisted to the top before being whisked back down again!

So, I do hope - particularly if you've never stepped foot in Great St Mary's before or have never taken a few moments to look around - that you'll pop in and say hello. Whether that feels like you'd be taking the plunge or just putting a toe in the water, you'll be most welcome.
